

CORRYONG, FULL DAY'S RIDE, 281Km

Walwa, Tintaldra, Corryong, Koetong, Tallangatta, Wodonga.

Corryong is about 120Km from Albury/Wodonga so you are going to have quite a few Ks of road to ride along the shores of the Murray arm of Lake Hume. No fuel or toilets before Walwa, so the order of the day as usual is full tanks and empty bladders. Quick stop there then on to Tintaldra where the pub is well known for the hospitality, particularly for bikers, so that will be a scheduled stop. On to Corryong where Jack Riley, reputed to inspire Banjo Paterson to write the Man from Snowy River, is buried. Corryong is the centre for many outdoor activities, such as horse riding, rock climbing, 4WD tours etc. This will be the lunch stop.

The return trip will be down the Murray Valley Highway, a well surfaced and interesting ride - If time permits a stop at Koetong Pub for a cooling diet Coke or two, say hello to mine Hosts Jim and Jane Boyle, then on to Tallangatta, the town that moved in the 50s to stay ahead of the rising water when the Hume dam wall was extended (Fuel, Food etc and the local Ulysses rally site usually in March, but already happened in Feb this year) before heading back along the shores of Lake Hume, the Mitta arm this time. There are a number of lakeside reserves for you to stop for a while and enjoy the view, and if you have your budgie smugglers with you, go for a dip.

281 Kms + stops-expect to be out for the day
